

**REPORT TO THE  
MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF  
CARBON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
SPECIAL MEETING  
Thursday, April 16, 2015  
County Courthouse, Rawlins, Wyoming**

A special meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners (BOCC) commenced Thursday, April 16, 2015 at 12:00 p.m. at the County Courthouse in Rawlins, Wyoming to discuss the county's information technology (IT) services. Attending the meeting were; Chairman John Espy; Vice Chairman John Johnson; Commissioners Sue Jones and Leo Chapman. Commissioner Lindy Glode was available via phone.

IT Director Matt Webster discussed the potential of sharing IT services with the City of Rawlins. There was discussion on the pros and cons of the idea and the costs and potential cost savings to the county and to taxpayers. Mr. Webster proposed splitting the cost by percentage of equipment to be supported, likely somewhere around 40% Rawlins and 60% county. Ultimately the BOCC asked Mr. Webster to proceed with negotiations noting there must be a clause for either party to exit the agreement if needed.

Commissioner Chapman moved to allow Matt Webster and the county's attorneys to proceed with negotiations for shared information technology services between the county and city of Rawlins with a 50/50 split and negotiating down to a 40% floor. Commissioner Jones seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Johnson moved to adjourn the meeting at 12:55 p.m. Commissioner Jones seconded and the motion carried unanimously.
