Board met at 2 o'clock P. M. this 1st. day of May A. D. 1917, pursuant to adjournemtn of morning session. Roll call showing present, Commissioners Robert A. Day, Andrew W. Rasmussen and L. B. Magor, Clerk. Commissioner Wm. A. Mc Kay, Chairman absent, In the absence of Chairman Mc Kay, Commissioner Robert A. Day was chosen Chairman Pro Tem.

Proceedings were had as follows, to-wit:-

Comes now CHARLES E. BLYDENBURGH, attorney for the Union Pacific Water Company, and represents to the Board that in view of the International difficuties and threats that spies and fanatics sympathizing with the enemies of the United States, may blow up and destroy property of public carriers or property on which the carriers depend for fuel, etc., that it has become necessary for the Union Pacific Water Company to appoint special guards to protect its property in this county, and in order that these guards may have proper authority to make arrests if occasion should require, requests that the County Commissioners should appoint such proper persons as may be designated by the Union Pacific Water Company or its officers, special Deputy Sheriffs under the provisions of Section 1222 and 1223 of the Wyoming Compiled Statutes 1910, such Deputies to be without expense to Carbon County; and the Board having considered the matter and believing that the request is reasonable:

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, That it is considered that there is extraordinary and unusual danger to property of Water Companies and public carriers within the County of Carbon, and that it is deemed necessary by said Board that special deputies should be appointed for the purpose of guarding property, owing to the International complications and the threats of foreign war;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That such proper persons as may be designated by the officials of the Union Pacific Water Company to guard its property in Carbon County, be given commissions as special deputy Sheriff's under the provisions of Section 1222 of the Compiled Statutes of Wyoming, 1910, without any expense to Carbon County; That the names to be designated shall in all cases be proper and efficient persons and shall be electors of the State of Wyoming and shall be under the control of the Sheriff of Carbon County, Wyoming; That whenever a request is made for the appointment of any person as special deputies by the officials of the Union Pacific Water Company, the matter shall be referred to M. E. Pickett, the Sheriff of Carbon County, Wyoming, to pass upon such persons as to whether or not they are proper persons to receive the commissions as Deputy Sheriffs, and upon their being approved by the said Sheriff the commission shall issue, said commission to be made out by the County Clerk.

That such appointment is made without expense to Carbon County, and the County reserved the rights, as provided in said section, to at any time revoke said commissions as Special Deputies, such appointments being also made subject to a bond being given by each appointee as aforesaid, holding forever harmless Carbon County, Wyoming, or the Sheriff of Carbon County, Wyoming, for all damages as a result of the official acts of said appointees.
