

## PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, JANUARY, 2nd. 1918.

Board met at 10 o'clock A. M. this 2nd, day of January A. D. 1918, in regular session as is by law required. Roll call showing present, Commissioners D. E. Winsor, Andrew W. Rasmussen, Wm. A. Mc Kay, Chairman and L. B. Magor, Clerk.

Proceedings were had as follows, to-wit:-

The Minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

**POLL AND ROAD TAX:**

Regarding the matter of the collection of Poll and Road Taxes by the Assessor at the time of assessment, it was regularly moved by Commissioner Winsor and seconded by Commissioner Rasmussen that all persons between the age of Twenty-one and Fifty years, inclusive, pay a Poll Tax of Two (\$2.00) Dollars for School Purposes in accordance with Section 2320 of the Wyoming Compiled Statutes of 1910, and also that each ~~xxxxx~~ able bodied man in the County between the age of Twenty-one and Fifty years, inclusive, pay a special Road Tax of Two (\$2.00) Dollars according to Section 2562, of the Wyoming Compiled Statutes of 1910. Motion carried.

The matter of estimating the cost of maintaining the County Government for the year, 1918, in Compliance with Section 1132, of the Compiled Statutes of Wyoming, 1910, was considered and after due calculations apportion<sup>ment</sup> was made as follows:- to-wit:-


GENERAL FUND -----	\$43,000.00

Mr. Jas. G. Dettinger, Mr. Harry Pantle and Mr. H. P. Flohr came before the Board with a petition signed by a number of Tax-Payers of Carbon County living in the vicinity of the town of Encampment, petitioning the Commissioners of Carbon County, for a road on the east side of Encampment Creek from Riverside Bridge to the Wilcox Bridge.

A letter was also received from Mr. W. T. Peryam of Riverside, Wyoming, protesting against the above mentioned road, running through his land.


After due consideration the Board agreed to lay the matter over for the present until sometime in the future when they could make a thorough investigation.

A request was submitted to the Board signed by the Sheriff and the County and Prosecuting Attorney for the appointment of an additional Deputy Sheriff at Baggs, Wyoming.

It was regularly moved and seconded that the Sheriff appoint a Deputy at Baggs Wyoming, at a salary not to exceed \$50.00 per month. Motion carried.
