Board met at 2 o'clock P. M. this 8th day of December A. D. 1920, pursuant to adjournment of morning session. Roll call showing all members present.

Proceedings were had as follows, to-wit:-

SPECIAL  
REDUCTION OF SCHOOL TAX LEVY, SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 13.

A petition was received signed by all the Trustees of School District No. 13, Carbon County, Wyoming and also a petition signed by several tax payers of said school district No. 13, praying that the levy for Special School taxes in said district for the year 1920 be reduced from five (5) mills to one and one-half mills (1½). After examination the following was offered by Commissioner Wm. A. Mc Kay.

WHEREAS there has been presented to this Board a petition signed by all the Trustees of School District No. Thirteen (13), Carbon County, Wyoming, praying that the

levy for special school taxes in said district for 1920 be reduced from five (5) mills to one and one-half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) mills, and whereas there has also been presented a petition signed by several tax payers of said school district, requesting that petition be granted and whereas it is shown upon investigation that the provisions of Section 9, Chapter 106, Session Laws, 1911, have not been complied with in so far that no affidavit of Clerk of said District, stating that notices of meeting were posted on front door of each school house and three additional public places, or number of votes cast for and against the question of increased tax levy, has been filed with the County Clerk and County Superintendent, and whereas it appears that the five (5) mill levy as made will raise an amount greatly in excess of the necessary requirements of said district for the present school year: that a levy of one and a half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) mills is and would have been sufficient to raise an amount necessary to rebuild the burned school house, purchase the necessary equipment and supplies and conduct the school the present school year.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the levy for special school taxes of five (5) mills, made upon the taxable property in School District No. Thirteen (13), Carbon County, Wyoming, for 1920, be and the same is hereby reduced to one and a half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) mills. That the County Treasurer, upon the serving upon him by the County Clerk of a certified copy of this resolution, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to accept the payment of special school taxes in School District Thirteen (13) based upon a levy of one and a half mills ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ), and he is hereby authorized and directed to cancel upon his tax books, all the unpaid taxes for the year 1920 in School District No. Thirteen special school tax in the amount of three and one-half ( $3\frac{1}{2}$ ) mills, and where taxes have been paid prior to the passage and service upon the County Treasurer of this resolution, he is authorized and directed to grant a rebate or refund to the tax payers who have already paid taxes in School District Thirteen (13) in the amount of three and one-half ( $3\frac{1}{2}$ ) mills special school tax.

Board met at 10 o'clock A. M. this 9th day of December A. D. 1920, pursuant to adjournment of December 8th. 1920. Roll call showing present, A. W. Rasmussen, R. T. Wood, Wm. A. Mc Kay, Chairman, Commissioners and R. A. Mager, Clerk.

Proceedings were had as follows, to-wit:-

A petition was received, signed by a number of qualified electors and taxpayers of Carbon County, Wyoming, asking that the Board designate as a County Road in Carbon County, Wyoming, the road commonly known as the Brown's Hill road. This road running over Miller Hill, through Sage Creek Basin, down Mc Carty's Canyon, past Ketchum Buttes and Five Buttes and over Brown's Hill to Savery.

The board after due consideration, laid the matter over until the County Surveyor could properly survey said road and prepare field notes of said survey, which survey would be started as soon as the weather would permit.
