

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS resumed its session this 8th, day of February A.D. 1924 at ten o'clock a.m.

During the session they were waited on by Mr. James Lamont, Mr. John Mahoney, Mr. S. J. Sharpe and Mr. R. L. Tully representing the Rawlins Meat & Live Stock Co., all of whom were owners of property affected by the proposed Rocky Mountain Highway.

The Board was able to reach an amicable arrangement with Mr. Lamont and from the others were others was offered the following propositions:

From Mr. Mahoney: "That the state build a fence with necessary gates on both sides of the Highway through his land; that the state put in the necessary culverts across the road to take care of irrigation water and to enable the irrigation of the lands as heretofore; that the county pay \$2,000.00 as damages to the irrigation system, ditches, laterals etc."

From Mr. Sharpe: "That the state build a fence with necessary gates on both sides ^{the} highway through his land and that county pay him for damages to his property \$3000.00".

From Mr. Tully: "That the state take care of his land as specified in Mr. Mahoney's proposition and pay him for damages to his property \$800.00."

The Board then recessed and informally took the propositions under consideration until 8 o'clock p.m. when they reconvened and drafted the following proposition:

That Mr. Mahoney be awarded, to cover in full all damages sustained ~~by~~ the Highway project, \$300.00. That Mr. Sharpe be awarded, to cover all damages sustained ~~by~~ the Highway project, \$150.00. That Mr. Tully be awarded, to cover all damages sustained ~~by~~ the Highway project, \$100.00.

There being nothing further to come before the Board it was regularly moved and seconded that they adjourn until the 4th, day of March A.D. 1924 at ten o'clock a.m.
