Linda A. Felton, County Clerk and Clerk of the Board presented her affidavit with reference to the publication of the proceedings of said Board held on September 5th, 1936 as the same were published in the Republican Bulletin on September 16, 1936 which affidavit was approved and ordered filed. Said Linda A. Felton also presented her affidavit with reference to the publication of the notice of bond issue and sale by the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming as the same appeared in the Republican Bulletin, the Wyoming Eagle, Denver Rocky Mountain News, Chicago Journal of Commerce, and The Day which affidavit was approved and ordered filed.

Petition by several qualified electors of Carbon County for the abandonment of a portion of the road known as the Old Saratoga-Walcott Highway described as follows: Beginning at a point in the west half of Section 1, T. 17 N., R. 8¹4 W., Said point being located S.1°24' W. 2214.7 feet from a point located S.2°06' E. 456.4 feet from a point located west 1455.7 feet from the north quarter-corner of said Section 1. Running thence in a general northerly direction through the following described lands: Section 1, T. 17 N., R. 8¹4 W. Sections 36, 35, 26, 23, 14, 11, and 2, T. 18 N., R. 8¹4 W. Sections 35, 26, 23, 14 and 11, T. 19 N., R. 8¹4 W. Terminating at a point in the NE¹4 SE¹4 of Section 11, T. 19 N., R. 8¹4 W., located N. 2°47' E. 1914.7 feet from a point located N. 89°53' W. 1301 feet from the southeast corner of said Section 11. Excepting such portions of the above described right-of-way for the old Saratoga-Walcott highway, as are included in the right-of-way for the new Saratoga-Walcott highway, known as Project 174 B.Cb 6, as established by the Wyoming Highway Department; Also another petition for the abandonment of a portion of the old county road between Elk Mountain and Hanna, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the south line of Sections 18, T. 20 N., R. 80 W., at the south quarter-corner of said Section 18; Running thence in a general northerly and northwesterly direction through the following described land; Section 18; Lot 4, Section 7, T. 20 N., R. 80 W. Sections 12, 2 and

1, T. 20 N., R. 81 W. Section 31. T. 21 N., R. 80 W. Sections 36, 25, 24, 13, 14, 11, 2 and 3, T. 21 N., R. 81 W. Terminating at a point in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3, T. 21 N., R. 81 W., which is the intersection of said Hanna-Elk Mountain county road with the old Lincoln Highway. Excepting such portions of the above described road as are included in the right-of-way for the new State Highway between Hanna and Elk Mountain, known as Project Cb 42., and the lists having been filed on the same dates with the said petitions purporting to contain abandonment of said proposed roads is requested the names and known Post Office addresses of each person owning or interested in the lands across which the same was brought up for consideration at this time,

After duly considering same it was regularly moved by Frank Schilt, and seconded by Eugene McCarthy that Tuesday, November 10th, 1936, be set as the day at noon thereof, on or before all objections to the abandonment of a portion of the old Saratoga-Walcott Highway and a portion of the old County road between Elk Mountain and Hanna, and claims for damages therefore should be filed with the County Clerk of Carbon County, Wyoming, and that due notice thereof as required by law, shall be given publication in the Rawlins Republican, for three successive weeks. Said Motion was adopted.

It was then regularly moved by Frank Schilt and seconded by Gus Larson which motion was adopted, that the County Clerk send by registered mail with return receipts requested, a copy of the published notice to all persons of record owning lands or claiming any interest in any lands traversed by said roads proposed to be vacated.

On motion made and carried meeting was regularly adjourned until Thursday, October 8th.
