Mr. R. E. Gilmor of the Union Pacific Land Department met with the Board relative to renewal of leases on stock trail north of Medicine Bow. The Board discussed this matter and Commissioner McCarthy introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption, seconded by Commissioner Hansen and unanimously carried:

RESOLUTION

RESOLVED, that certain agreements made and entered into as of the 2 day of December, 1941, by and between the Union Pacific Railroad Company, a Corporation of the State of Utah, party of the first part and the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Carbon, State of Wyoming, party of the second part, with reference to the payment by the Union Pacific Railroad Company of one-half of the rental of certain lands leased by this Board from Susan J. Quealy and Richards Brothers, Inc., be and the same is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed, and that the execution thereof on behalf of said Board of County Commissioners by its Chairman, attested by the County Clerk of Carbon County, by whom the seal of said County has been affixed, be and the same is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.

Copies of leases and land affected are on file in the County Clerk's office.

*Stock trail*

A motion was made by Commissioner Hansen, seconded by McCarthy and unanimously carried, that the County expense for stock trail north of Medicine Bow be presented to the Taylor Grazing Service for payment of the Counties share of lease for this stock trail.

Thereupon the Board adjourned until the following day.

The Board resumed its Session December 3, 1941, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., all present, John F. Gooldy, Chairman.

The Board of Commissioners thereupon canvassed the vote of School District No. 18 in the matter of issuing School Bond. The result of this vote is as follows:

Ballot Box A 90 tax payers for bonds, 47 tax payers voted against bonds.

Ballot Box B 29 non-tax payers for bonds, 3 non-tax payers voted against bonds.

The monthly reports of County Officers were audited, approved and placed on file.

The following tax rebates and abatements were allowed by the Board:

Vera V. Daley, Rawlins, tax rebate \$4.00, account erroneous payment of poll tax.

George W. Watts, Lamont, tax abatement \$34.60, for 1938 and 1939, account erroneous assessment.

The bond of Mrs. Ruth Marie Wiant, Treasurer of School District No. 23, in the amount of \$1000.00 was approved by the Board.

Certificate of Purchase No. 3208 on  $\frac{1}{2}SW\frac{1}{4}$ , Sec. 20, Twp. 17, R. 77, ---assigned to H. E. Maddock of Laramie, Wyo., for \$10.51.

Thereupon the Board adjourned until December 4, 1941.

The Board resumed its Session December 4, 1941, all present, John F. Gooldy, presiding. *road*

A motion was made by Commissioner McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and carried, that Easement for Right-of-Way over the following County property be executed by the Board of Commissioners for the Town of Saratoga. All of Lots 23 and 24, Block 10 of Riverside Addition; and all of Lots 1 and 12, Block 3, Crawford's Addition to the Town of Saratoga.

A motion was made by Commissioner McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and so carried, granting a Warranty Deed to D. O. Zinn on the following described land as per the agreement on record in Book 219, Page 139:  $\frac{1}{2}SW\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$ , Sec. 17;  $\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 18, all in Twp. 12, N. Range 91, West of the 6th P. M.

A request was received from the County Health Officer, Dr. Raymond Barber, that the County Commissioners supplement the Health Officer's Budget in the amount of \$108.03 from the emergency fund, due to depletion of this budget which was caused by an abnormal amount of sickness. A motion was made by Commissioner McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and carried, whereby the budget officer was authorized to transfer \$108.03 from the emergency fund to the Health Officer's Budget.

\$249.86 was transferred to the livestock inspection budget from the emergency fund as per authority granted the budget officer at the November 6th meeting of the Board of Commissioners.

On motion made by Commissioner McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and so carried, \$1010.71 was transferred from the emergency fund to the miscellaneous budget to cover the deficit in the highway right-of-way fund which became depleted when judgments were rendered by the Court against the County in the matter of the Baggs-Dixon right-of-way condemnation hearing.

By unanimous action of the Board, the budget officer was authorized to make all necessary adjustments within the various budgets of the county offices and activities, and that notations be made in the budget record and approved by the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners.

Thereupon the Board adjourned until December 15, 1941, at which time the budget requirements of the various offices will be heard.
