Thereupon the Board adjourned until December 16, 1941.

The Board resumed its session December 16, 1941, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., all members presents, John F. Gooldy presiding.

Protests were received by the Board of Commissioners from the W. C. T. U., Bennett Hardware Company, and various individuals from Rawlins and Parco, against the granting of a liquor license to Sam Bailey. The Board decided to defer any action on Mr. Bailey's application until January 7, 1942, at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

The following tax rebates and abatements were allowed by the Board:

Mrs. Minnie Greenfield, Rawlins, tax rebate, \$6.49, account of erroneous assessment.

J. G. Lyon, Rawlins, tax rebate, \$2.00, account of double payment of poll tax.

G. M. Holland, Encampment, tax abatement, \$16.55, homestead exemption.

A petition was received from F. H. Healey and others, requesting the Commissioners to establish a road between Saratoga and Encampment.

A petition was received from W. J. Horn and others, requesting the Commissioners to establish a road from the proposed Saratoga-Encampment Highway to the Saratoga Centennial Highway.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hansen, seconded by McCarthy and unanimously carried, and S. S. Sharp was appointed as viewer of the proposed Saratoga-Encampment and Saratoga-Centennial Highways, as described in the above mentioned petitions.

A motion was made by McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried, adopting the following resolution: (Saratoga-Encampment Road)

Whereas,

The Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, have decided to locate a road to be known as Saratoga-Encampment commencing at a point which is N.1° 31'E., 563.4 feet from a point which is N.23° 11'E., 2325.1 feet from a point on the south boundary of Section 1, T.17N., R.84W. of the 6th P.M., Wyoming, which is 2349.0 feet west of the south  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of said Section 1 when measured along said south boundary; thence southerly through Sections 1, 12 and 11, T.17N., R.84W. to the intersection of the center line of First Street with the north line of Rochester Street in the Town of Saratoga; thence southerly along the center line of First Street to an intersection with the north line of Maple Avenue; thence southerly through Sections 14, 13, 24 and 25, T. 17N., R.84W., Sections 30, 31 and 32, T.17N., R.83W., Sections 6, 5, 8, 9, 17, 16, 20, 29 and 32, T.16N., R.83W., Sections 5, 8, 7, 18, 19, 30, T.15N., R.83W. and Sections 25 and 36, T.15N., R.84W. to a point on the south boundary of said Section 36, which is 4634.0 feet east of the southwest corner of said Section 36 when measured along said south boundary and excluding therefrom that portion of the highway on First street in the Town of Saratoga between the north line of Rochester Street and the north line of Maple Avenue.

The proposed location and width of right of way required are set forth in detail on Map on file with the County Clerk and may be examined at his office.

All objections thereto and claims for damages must be filed in writing with the County Clerk of said County before noon on the 19th day of January A.D., 1942, or such road will be established without reference to such objections or claims for damages.

A motion was made by McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried, adopting the following resolution: (Saratoga-Centennial Road)

Whereas,

The Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, have decided to locate a road to be known as Saratoga-Centennial commencing at a point which is S.57° 39'E., 1667.6 feet from a point which is S.74° 47'E., 180.0 feet from a point on the west boundary of Section 15, T.16N., R.83W., of the 6th P.M., Wyoming which point is 88.0 feet south of the west  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of said Section 15 when measured along said west boundary; thence northwesterly through Sections 15 and 16, T.16N., R.83W. to a point on the west boundary of said Section 16 which is 1442.3 feet north of the west  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of said Section 16 when measured along said west boundary.

The proposed location and width of right of way required are set forth in detail on Map on file with the County Clerk and may be examined at his office.

All objections thereto and claims for damages must be filed in writing with the County Clerk of said County before noon on the 19 day of January, A. D., 1942, or such road will be established without reference to such objections or claims for damages.

A warrant in the amount of \$315.29 to the Carbon County Fair Board was allowed.

Thereupon the Board adjourned subject to the call of the Chairman.
