# CANVASSING BOARD - SARATOGA SCHOOL BONDS

The Board then proceeded to act as a canvassing Board, as required by Section 67-807, of the Wyoming Compiled Statutes for 1945, to canvass the returns of the special school bond election held within Platte Valley High School District Number Two, in the County of Carbon, State of Wyoming, on October 28th, 1949, at which was submitted to the voters of said District, the following question:

"Shall the Board of Trustees of Platte Valley High School District No. Two in Carbon County, Wyoming, be authorized to issue negotiable coupon bonds of the District, in the aggregate amount of \$25,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds with which to complete a building for vocational education purposes for the high school district, and the equipment thereof, and to refund an existing indebtedness incurred for the erection of said building within said district, said bonds to bear interest at a rate not to exceed five percent (5%) payable semi-annually on the 1st day of December, and the 1st day of June of each year, said bonds to be dated December 1, 1949, and to be due and payable as follows:

\$2500.00 on December 1st on each of the years 1950 to 1959 inclusive.

And upon the conclusion thereof, the Board found the proposal so submitted carried in the affirmative by the following vote:

Ballot Box "A", Bonds, Yes, 26; Bonds, No, 0  
Ballot Box "B", Bonds, Yes, 91; Bonds, No, 21

The Board then executed its certificate attested by the County Clerk, declaring the proposal so submitted at said election to have carried by a majority vote in each of the ballot boxes.

APPOINTMENT of Beverly Lyon as Deputy County Treasurer and Bond for \$5,000.00 was approved.





The Board of Commissioners met at 10:00 A.M., all present, Jack Sullivan, Chairman.

The minutes of meetings held Nov. 1, and 2, were read and approved.

The Board then proceeded to act as a canvassing board as required by Section 67-807 of the Wyoming Compiled Statutes for 1945, to canvass the returns of the Special School Bond Election held within School District No. 3 in the County of Carbon and State of Wyoming, on November 8, 1949, at which was submitted to the voters of said District the following question:

- "Shall the Board of Trustees of School District No. 3, in the County of Carbon, and State of Wyoming, be authorized to issue the coupon bonds of the District in an amount not to exceed \$240,000.00, said bonds to be dated July 1, 1950, to bear interest at a rate not to exceed three per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of January and July, and to mature serially \$20,000.00 on the first day of July in the years 1951 to 1962, both inclusive, subject to redemption on the first day of July, 1960, or on any interest payment date thereafter, for the purpose of the erection of school buildings therein and the equipment of the same?"

and upon the conclusion thereof, the Board found that the question so submitted carried in the affirmative by the following vote:
