PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 1

Proposed to amend Section 4, Article 5 of said Constitution to read as follows:

"Article 5, Section 4. The supreme court of the state shall consist of four justices who shall be elected by the qualified electors of the state at a general state election at the times and places at which state officers are elected; and their term of office shall be eight (8) years, commencing from and after the first Monday in January next succeeding their election, provided that the first term of the additional justice authorized by this amendment shall be four years only. The justice having the shortest time remaining unexpired of a full eight-year term shall be the chief justice and shall preside at all terms of the supreme court, and in case of his absence, the justice having in like manner the next shortest term to serve shall preside in his stead. If a vacancy occur in the office of a justice of the supreme court, the governor shall appoint a person to hold the office until the election and qualification of a person to fill the unexpired term occasioned by such vacancy, which election shall take place at the next succeeding general election. If a vacancy occur in the office of a justice of the supreme court, the governor shall appoint a person to hold the office until the election and qualification of a person to fill the unexpired term occasioned by such vacancy, which election shall take place at the next succeeding general election." (sic)

This proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Wyoming increases the number of Supreme Court Justices from three to four, for the purpose of expediting the work of the Supreme Court of Wyoming.


