


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

STATE EXAMINERS REPORT:

The annual report of county Offices was received from the State Examiner. The comments of the Examiners relative to improvements in records of various offices were noted and the officers were notified to consider the suggestions of the Examiners.

RIGHT OF WAY EASEMENT - Kenneth D. Luff, Alpine Oil Company and Savery Oil & Gas Company.

The Commissioners granted the right of way easement as follows:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That for and in consideration of the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and confessed, CARBON COUNTY, WYOMING, a body politic and corporate, hereinafter called the Grantor, hereby grant to KENNETH D. LUFT, ALPINE OIL COMPANY, and SAVERY OIL & GAS COMPANY; hereinafter called the Grantees, the right to lay out, construct, inspect, operate and maintain a natural gas transmission line over and across the following described lands located in the County of Carbon and State of Wyoming, to-wit:

Southeast 1/4 Southwest 1/4 Section 24, T14N, R90W, and Northeast 1/4
Southeast 1/4 Section 15, T13N, R89W

The right of way hereby granted being more particularly described as follows:

A right of way fifty (50) feet in width being twenty-five (25) feet on either side of a center line extending from a point South 63 degrees 00 minutes East, 3095.9 feet from Northwest corner of Section 23, T15N, R91W, and extending generally Southeast 87,003.7 feet to a point North 5 degrees 13 minutes West, 2299.8 feet from the Southeast corner of Section 15, T13N, R89W, Carbon County, Wyoming.

Grantor also grants the right of ingress and egress to and from the said land for any and all purposes necessary and incident to the exercise by the grantee of the rights granted by this conveyance.

The grant herein contained is an easement and is granted for so long as the right of way herein conveyed is used for the primary purpose of transmitting gas and the same shall terminate and revert to the Grantor when said right of way is no longer used for the purpose herein granted.


The Grantees, and each of them, by acceptance and delivery of this instrument, covenant and agree that they, and each of them, jointly and severally, shall be responsible for any damage or injury caused from laying of subject line across the two defined county road crossings. And Grantees, do further covenant and agree, jointly and severally, by acceptance and delivery of this instrument, they, and each of them, shall indemnify and save harmless the Grantor from any and all liability which may arise by the granting of this easement.


