JUSTICE OF THE PEACE PRECINCT - ELK MOUNTAIN:  
A motion was made by Salisbury, seconded by Orton and carried whereby the following resolution was adopted, to wit:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Section 5-85, Wyoming Statutes, 1957, provides that it shall be the duty of the County Commissioners in each county in the State of Wyoming to divide the county into justice of the peace precincts which shall be composed of one or more voting precincts, and

WHEREAS, the interests of justice require the establishment and creation of an additional justice of peace precinct to be officed at Elk Mountain, Wyoming.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that there be, and there is hereby established the Elk Mountain Justice of Peace precinct with offices at Elk Mountain, Wyoming.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the territory to be included within said Justice of Peace precinct shall coincide and include voting Precinct District 9, Precinct 1.
