PUBLIC HEARING

Public hearing on Petition to establish a special museum district to be known as the LITTLE SNAKE RIVER MUSEUM DISTRICT, held at 10:00 A. M. on Thursday, November 9, 1972, in Commissioners Room, Courthouse Building, Rawlins, Wyoming.

MR. HALL: Let the record show that a public hearing was convened in the Commissioners Room, Courthouse Building, on the proposed establishment of the Little Snake River Museum District. The Pro-tem Chairman, John Orton, read into the record Notice of Public Hearing as published pursuant to law in the Rawlins Daily Times on September 30, October 7, and 14, 1972, which Notice of Public Hearing read as follows and was placed on file:

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

"NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a Petition to establish a special museum district to be known as the LITTLE SNAKE RIVER MUSEUM DISTRICT has been presented and filed with the Board of County Commissioners, Carbon County, Wyoming. The proposed special museum district shall be composed of the following described lands bounded as follows:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of Township 12 North, Range 87 West which point is the Wyoming Colorado boundary; Thence, North along the Range line between Ranges 86 West and 87 West; to the Northeast corner of Township 16 North Range 87 West; Thence, West along the Township line between Townships 16 and 17 North to the Southeast corner of Township 17 North Range 91 West. Thence North along the Range line between Ranges 90 West and 91 West to the Sweetwater County line; Thence, West along the Carbon-Sweetwater County line to the Northwest corner of Township 19, North Range 93 West (The Northwestern corner of Carbon County, Wyoming;) Thence, South along the Carbon-Sweetwater County line to the Wyoming-Colorado State line; Thence, East along the Wyoming-Colorado State line to the place of beginning.

"NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that a public hearing on said Petition will be held in the Commissioners Room, Courthouse Bldg., Rawlins, Wyoming, on Thursday, November 9, 1972 at 10:00 A.M. o'clock at which time and place any person may appear and be heard concerning any and all matters affecting the creation of such District.

John Orton, Pro-Tem Chairman of the County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, convened said hearing at 10:00 o'clock A. M. and called for persons to be heard concerning any and all matters affecting the creation of said district. There being no protestants appearing, the Board of County Commissioners then established December 11, 1972, as the date under which the protest period would expire pursuant to Section 18-330.8, of the Wyoming Statutes, 1957, as amended.

There being no further business the Board adjourned until 2:00 P.M. Nov. 9, 1972.

The Board resumed its session, all Commissioners present, John Niland, Chairman.

EXTENSION OF LEASE: This extension of lease agreement made and entered into this 9th day of November, 1972, by and between the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF CARBON, STATE OF WYOMING, a body politic and corporate, party of the first part and LINCOLN-WAY, CORP., a Wyoming corporation, party of the second part hereinafter called lessee.

WHEREAS, the party of the first part on the 1st day of April, 1965, entered into an amended lease agreement with Malcolm R. Smith and John C. Ratliff, a co-partnership in the name and style of El Rancho Plaza, attached hereto and made a part by this reference; and

WHEREAS, Malcolm R. Smith and John C. Ratliff thereafter assigned their interest in and to such amended lease to Lincoln-Way Corp., a Wyoming corporation; and

WHEREAS, it is now the desire of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Carbon, State of Wyoming, to extend the period of such lease for a period of twenty-five years.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the sum of seven thousand and no/100 (\$7000.00.) in hand paid the receipt and adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged as having been paid to the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Carbon, State of Wyoming, by Lincoln-Way Corp., it is agreed as follows:

(1) That the terms of the original lease dated April 1, 1965 be and is hereby extended for a period of twenty-five (25) additional years so that the terms of such lease shall not expire until March 31, 2040.

(2) That all the terms, covenants and conditions contained in the original lease shall be applicable to such extension as described in Book 468, Page 504, Records of County Clerk of Carbon County, Wyoming,
