Public notice is hereby given that at the General Election to be held in the State of Wyoming on November 5, 1974, the following proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of Wyoming will be submitted to the electors of this State for adoption or rejection, to become valid as a part of said Constitution, if ratified by a majority of said electors.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 1

The adoption of the proposed amendment will provide taxpayers with protection against double taxation, by providing a tax credit against any liability arising from a tax on income, in the event of the passage of a state income tax.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 2

The adoption of the proposed amendment will provide a mineral excise tax on the privilege of severing or extracting coal, petroleum, natural gas, oil shale, and such other minerals as may be designated by the Legislature, of one and one-half percent (1½%) of the value of the gross product extracted, which tax will be in addition to any other excise, severance or ad valorem tax on such minerals; will create the Permanent Wyoming Trust Fund which fund shall remain inviolate; will provide that monies in the fund may be loaned to political subdivisions of the state or otherwise invested, as the Legislature may provide; and shall require that all income from fund investments shall be deposited annually in the general fund.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 3

This amendment will eliminate the 12 mill tax collected by the counties for support of the public schools, and will replace it with a tax, not to exceed 12 mills, to be levied, collected and distributed on a statewide basis.
