A zone change from RAM (Ranching, Agriculture, Mining) to HB (Highway Business) to bring a non-conforming use into conformance with County zoning on 32.9+ acres of land legally described as in the W½NE¼ of Section 21, Township 26 North, Range 89 West, Carbon County, Wyoming.

Case No. 86-11 - To amend the Carbon County Zoning resolution of 1972, specifically Section 270, adding language that allows the denial of a zone change based on creation of an improper subdivision.

A motion was made by Daily and seconded by York to approve Case No. 86-12.

Case No. 86-12 - To amend the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 1972, specifically to change the wording to conform with the renumbering of Wyoming Statutes.

Case No. 86-13 - To amend the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 1972, specifically Section 100, sub-section 130, changing item 134 regarding Declaration of Purpose to include "safety from flooding" and delete "convenience of access" to read "to secure safety from fire, flooding, panic, and other dangers, and to provide adequate light and air."

Roll was called with the following results: Grieve, aye; York, aye; Daily, aye.

A motion was made by Daily and seconded by York to approve Case No. 86-14.

Case No. 86-14 - To amend the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 1972, specifically to change the wording in Section 310 (Ranching, Agriculture, and Mining District purpose statement) to more general terms.

Roll was called with the following results: Grieve, aye; York, aye; Daily, aye.

A motion was made by York and seconded by Daily to approve Case No. 86-15.

Case No. 86-15 - To amend the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 1972, specifically Section 400, sub-section 463, to delete "paved (hard surface)" from item 463.3 pertaining to Mobile Home Parks to read "All roads shall have a minimum surface of 25 feet."

Roll was called with the following results: Grieve, aye; York, aye; Daily, aye.

A motion was made by Daily and seconded by York to approve Case No. 86-16.

Case No. 86-16 - To amend the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 1972, specifically Section 400, sub-section 463, deleting item 463.4 regarding requirements for underground installation of power and phone utilities in Mobile Home Parks and renumbering 463.5 to 463.4, and 463.6 to 463.5.

Roll was called with the following results: Grieve, aye; York, aye; Daily, aye.

A motion was made by York and seconded by Daily to approve Case No. 86-17.

Case No. 86-17 - To amend the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 1972, specifically Section 500, sub-section 530, changing item 534 to allow for the Zoning Officer to extend building permits for one year.

A motion was made by Daily and seconded by York to approve Case No. 86-18.

Case No. 86-18 - To amend the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 1972, specifically Section 600, definition of "Primary Residence" to delete the wording related to employment and vacation.
